

Title: The Mechanical Licensing Collective – A Legal Perspective (Updated for 2023)

Length: 60 minutes

Description: The Music Modernization Act (MMA) significantly changed the copyright law with respect to compulsory mechanical licensing of musical works for digital uses. It created a new blanket license and a mechanical licensing collective to administer the license and collect and distribute royalties. The Mechanical Licensing Collective (The MLC) began operating in earnest in 2020, and the blanket license became available on January 1, 2021. This CLE program explores the legal issues the MMA was designed to solve and how it solved them, the implementation of the statutory requirements, technological considerations, and current legal practice implications for attorneys representing musical works owners and administrators and digital music providers.
